

## **Directions to Madingley Hall, Cambridge**

### **Travelling by Road**

#### **FROM THE NORTH - A1 and Huntingdon.**

The officially signposted route involves several difficult junctions. We recommend instead that you leave the A14 for Dry Drayton, just after Bar Hill. In Dry Drayton ignore the first sign to Madingley, but then turn left at the second sign, just before the church. At the T-junction in Madingley turn right. You will pass The Three Horseshoes public house on the left. After 100 yards turn right at a mini roundabout through the Hall gates, opposite a left turn to Cambridge.

#### **FROM NEWMARKET and the East (A14).**

Leave the Cambridge northern by-pass on the slip-road leading to the M11/A1307/A14 - signed Huntingdon. Keep straight on and once round the left hand bend move to the right hand lane - signposted The Midlands (The North), Huntingdon A14. Immediately after re-joining the A14 fork left for Madingley Village (signed Madingley 1 1/2 miles). Pass The Three Horseshoes public house on the left. After 100 yards turn right at a mini roundabout through the Hall gates, opposite a left turn to Cambridge.

#### **FROM THE SOUTH (M11).**

Leave the M11 at Junction 13 signed Bedford and Cambridge (A428/A1303). Turn left towards Bedford (A428). 250 yards on turn right to Madingley. In just over a mile you come to a mini roundabout at the bottom of the hill with the Hall gates in front of you.

#### **FROM THE WEST (A428).**

After the Dry Drayton-Hardwick roundabout the single carriageway becomes a dual carriageway. Half a mile on take the slip road on the left signed Cambridge and Madingley. At the roundabout turn left for Madingley. The Hall gates are on the left, at a mini roundabout, opposite the road signposted for Cambridge. The turn into the drive is sharp.

#### **PARKING AT THE HALL.**

Cars may be left in front of the main Hall while you register but should then be taken to the rear car park. Please do not park in the cobbled courtyard except to unload luggage. There is ample car parking in the car park reached via the roadway branching to the left at the top of the drive.

Parking for members with reduced mobility.

Course members with reduced mobility are advised to park on the front gravel forecourt as near as possible to the main entrance to the Hall where the reception office is located. There are two small steps leading to the reception area.

Course members who are wheelchair users are advised to take their vehicle through the car park and into the cobbled courtyard. The paved area is ramped to the rear door to the Hall (the large oak door) which leads via the corridor to the reception area. Vehicles can be left in the courtyard for the duration of the course and advice on parking position will be given on arrival.

In addition to the ambience of a gracious country house, the Hall offers excellent catering, en-suite accommodation, a residents' bar, ample car parking, tennis court and croquet lawns in season.

### **Travelling by rail**

Cambridge railway station is in Station Road (see map).

### **Travelling by coach**

The bus station is in Drummer Street in Cambridge (see map).

### **Travelling from Cambridge**

When you arrive in Cambridge we advise you to take a taxi to Madingley Hall. Taxi ranks are adjacent to both the bus and rail stations.
